Emmaus International - World Assembly 2022



ounded in 1971 on the initiative of Abbé Pierre, Emmaus International is a non-confessional solidarity movement that fights against poverty and exclusion. It brings together more than 425 organisations in 41 countries across Europe, Africa, America and Asia. They all share the same values of welcome, solidarity, openness, respect and sharing, in very different social, economic and political contexts. Their common objectives are to act against the causes of poverty and to bring about social change by enabling the most disadvantaged people to become protagonists in their own lives.

The Emmaus organisations around the world carry out social action and campaigning on three fronts: a truly ethical and solidarity-based economy for a sustainable world, social and environmental justice for access to fundamental rights, and peace and freedom of movement and settlement for universal citizenship.

As the universal legatee of Abbé Pierre, Emmaus International is also responsible for protecting and keeping alive the memory of Abbé Pierre and the battles he fought tirelessly throughout his life.



he most notable event for Emmaus International in 2022 was certainly the organisation of the World Assembly in Uruguay. Not only was it our first opportunity to meet face-to-face on an international scale after too many years of the Covid-19 pandemic, but it was also the first World Assembly to be held in Latin America since the Movement was founded, and only the third to be held outside Europe.

I can confidently say that all those who had the opportunity to take part in this event were able to measure the richness that comes from both the diversity of our groups and our actions, and the cohesion made possible by our shared values. It was an opportunity to reflect on our actions over the next 4 years, a time for political commitment, with meetings with activists from many countries in the region to talk about their actions, a time of remembrance with the commemoration of

the infamous 1963 shipwreck, and, of course, a time of festivities, exchanges and meetings, in line with our Movement.

Following the World Assembly, the elected members of the Board and the International Secretariat started working to prepare the mandate. A 2023-2025 action plan was adopted, and the International Secretariat was reorganised under the responsibility of a new Chief Executive, Adrien Chaboche, who took over from Nathalie Pere-Marzano.

A new plan and a mainly new team, but always the same goal: serving the most vulnerable first.

This key moment in the life of the Movement provides an opportunity to decide on the major collective guidelines and for all the member groups to elect the Chair. In each region (Africa, America, Asia and Europe), Regional Assemblies elect the 24 councillors who.

along with the Chair, make up the Emmaus International Board. Elected bodies in the regions lead the implementation of these guidelines with the support of teams made up of permanent staff members.

EMMAUS WORLD ASSEMBLY IN URUGUAY

n May 2022, over 260 Emmaus groups were represented at the 14th World Assembly, held in Piriapolis, Uruguay. This reflects Emmaus organisations' commitment to remaining part of the melting pot that Abbé Pierre initiated in 1971 with the creation of Emmaus International. It also demonstrates our willingness to work together. This was particularly evident during the workshops and debates. A very positive sign of the vitality of our Movement. The event also provided an opportunity to welcome and hear from a number of wellknown friends: José Alberto Mujica, former resistance fighter during the dictatorship and President of the Republic of Uruguay from 2010 to 2015. Tarcila Rivera Zea. Quechua activist for the rights of women and indigenous peoples, and Olivier de Schutter, United Nations Special Rapporteur on Poverty.

With the global context of various crises. wars, threats to climate justice, international migration, poverty and precariousness, this 14th World Assembly has drawn attention to the fact that groups must resist the grip of neo-liberal thinking and preserve their economic self-sufficiency while remaining faithful to our fundamental values and principles.

It is now up to all Emmaus members to make the resolutions adopted by this World Assembly their own by taking part in discussion and communication forums, raising the awareness of younger generations and fighting to ensure that our independence is always preserved.

Emmaus International's elected representatives and the Emmaus International Secretariat (EIS) team have since been working to implement the resolutions and guidelines voted on in Piriapolis.

More than ever, let's fight together to change the world!



RESULTS OF SOLIDARITY AND CAMPAIGNING

any of the world's countries were just emerging from the Covid-19 pandemic, with depleted economies and populations still heavily dependent on international aid, when Russia's brutal and unjustified invasion of Ukraine disrupted the beginnings of economic recovery, directly affecting the most vulnerable populations with an often unsustainable rise in food and energy prices. Faced with this situation, Emmaus groups around the world have once again demonstrated their exceptional ability to help the most disadvantaged.

In 2022, a total of €1,046,195 was collected to carry out the various international solidarity and campaigning programmes. Since 2020, these programmes have been divided into 4 dedicated Funds:

- → Support for groups and regions
- → Access to rights programme
- → Action plan and advocacy campaigns
- → Support for Alliances and Partnerships

SUPPORT FOR GROUPS AND REGIONS

A number of measures were introduced in 2022 to support social projects and strengthen the economic activities of our groups, respond to emergency situations and support the most excluded people. Among these measures, a special food aid fund has been maintained to help people in an economic situation that is still difficult in the wake of the Covid-19 pandemic and made worse by the Russian invasion of Ukraine.

TESTIMONY

Mohd Fahim, a small-scale wheat and vegetable farmer in India, who has benefitted from the Emmaus Tara Projects support programme.



"Chemical farming is common in our area. Chemical fertilizer producing companies are active in our area to market their products. They are disorienting the farmers with the

false claims of the use of chemicals safe with more yields. I also used chemicals earlier. Thanks to Tara, who raised awareness about the ill effects of the chemical farming, now I am a bit more aware and have reduced drastically the use of chemical fertilizers. I am using the vermin compost and vermin wash produced by Tara in my agriculture field. I am also using cauliflower saplings from Tara nursery. It resulted into good yield this season."

ACCESS TO RIGHTS PROGRAMMES

Emmaus International has been running large-scale collective programmes for over 20 years. With the support of several of the Movement's groups, they enable people living in extreme poverty to build alternatives for access to and management of their rights as citizens, particularly in the areas of water, health and education. These alternatives show that another development model is possible: they serve as examples for fair and equitable public policies.

TESTIMONY

Emmanuel Siambo, Chair of the Mutual Health Organisation in Burkina Faso



"Emmaus International has been involved in mutual health organisations for around twenty years. It all began in 2000 when Abbé Pierre and the Board noted

the inequalities and injustice experienced by some Emmaus groups in terms of access to healthcare, depending on the country. Initially, we set up solidarity funds to support Emmaus organisations in countries where there were no public policies for access to healthcare. But today, these funds have become genuine mutual health organisations in which members are fully involved in terms of strategy, management and governance".

THE ACTION PLAN AND ADVOCACY CAMPAIGNS

Within the Emmaus Movement, solidarity must be seen as a political commitment, a vehicle for social change. At the World Assembly in May 2022 in Piriápolis, Uruguay, our Movement committed to carry out collective actions and lobbying campaigns involving all the Emmaus International regions, particularly on the issues of climate justice, international migration and education to raise awareness.

TESTIMONY

Luc Duffles Aldon - Brazil Solidarity Coalition



"Founded in 2018 at the time of the far right's victory in Brazil, the Brazil Solidarity Coalition brings together 18 French organisations and for the past 5 years has contin-

ued its work of echoing the warning cries from social organisations and movements in Brazil. Together, we have taken part in two summer universities for social movements in France. involved key witnesses at festivals and regularly answered questions from French and European politicians on the human rights situation in Brazil - namely through the publica-

tion of 3 editions of the Warning Barometer. The Brazil Barometer is an awareness-raising and campaigning tool that you can use from the first time you read it. Finally, together with our partners, we are following the campaign against the signing of the EU-Mercosur free trade agreement."

SUPPORTING ALLIANCES AND PARTNERSHIPS

In 2022. Emmaus International continued to take part in several discussion forums organised by the Collective of international solidarity and citizen commitment organisations (CRID in French). In fact, we co-sponsored the Citizens' Summit on Migration on 30th September and 1st October 2022, in conjunction with the March to Brussels initiative.

the rest of the regions. Emmaus does not want to be complicit in murderous laws. It couldn't be any other way, there we found ourselves raising our voices saying 'Rights, not Deaths!' Together with other organisations, sharing experiences and struggles. It was emotional and sad, because some of the people that took part in the march had lost their loved ones and shared their pain and the helplessness of seeing that almost no one cares".

The archives processed by Emmaus International are increasingly in demand and are gaining visibility thanks to the precise and serious work carried out over a number of years, enabling producers and directors to make increasing use of this material.

Here are some examples:

→ The production and broadcast on France 5 of the programme C Jamy "La vie secrète de l'abbé Pierre" (The Secret Life of Abbé Pierre)



→ Major support for the production of Frederic Tellier's biopic, due for release in November 2023



→ The launch of a podcast series on RCF, "Les colères de l'abbé Pierre" (The anger of Abbé Pierre) to be broadcast from 1st February 2022





BREAKDOWN OF RESOURCES AND EXPENDITURES

The 2022 financial year closed with a surplus of €296,252, due in part to a significant increase in subscriptions in connection with the organisation of the World Assembly, as well as an exceptional number of legacies. These exceptional resources more than offset the cost, also exceptional, of organising the World Assembly (€497,970).

This positive result was allocated in full to the organisation's solidarity reserves.

Communications costs were particularly low due to the priority given to organising the World Assembly, which was where we channelled most of our efforts during the year. The year 2022 is also a year of transition between two mandates and is therefore a year that will necessarily not have as many new actions.

Most of our solidarity and political commitments (74%) are funded by annual solidar-

ity sales and voluntary contributions from our groups. This solidarity, based on sharing between Emmaus groups, is one of the things that makes us unique. It reflects the spirit and values of the Movement.

We would also like to thank the Abbé Pierre Foundation for its support for our Housing programme, and Emmaus France and Emmaus UK for their contributions to funding Emmaus International's work.
